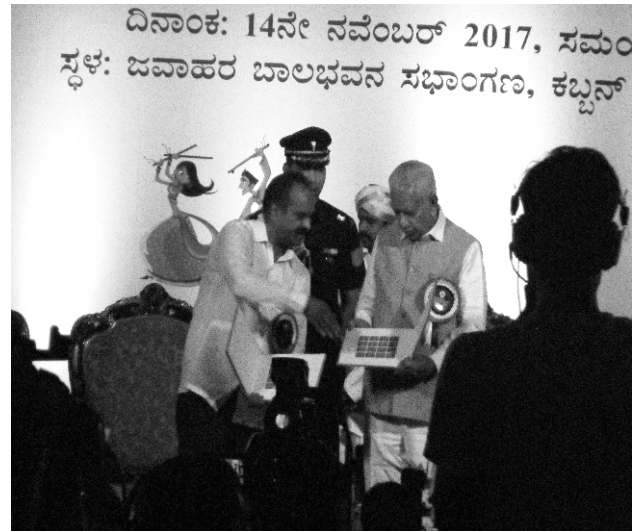


The winners at the National level, whose family income is less than Rs. 5000/- per month are also eligible to receive scholarship from ICCW till the child completes 12th std education.

KSCCW has been nominated by the Registrar General of the High Court of Karnataka as the sole scrutiny agency for scrutinizing adoption petitions filed in the state of Karnataka.

Children in need of care and protection, who are eligible for adoption, are placed in adoption by Specialized Adoption Agencies through a centralized computer system called (Child Adoption Resource Information and Guidance System). There are 29 Specialized Adoption Agencies who are licensed by the state to place children in adoption. KSCCW receives adoption petitions from the District & Session Courts of the Districts and the City Civil Court in Bangalore. KSCCW scrutinizes the documentation in the accompanying dossier to check if the process followed is as per the guidelines notified by the Central Adoption and Resource Authority (CARA).

A scrutiny team, comprising of a scrutiny officer and a member of KSCCW, meet the prospective adoptive family to assess whether the placement is in the best interest of the child. A report is submitted to the concerned court. As part of the process, KSCCW ensures that information regarding the disclosure of adoption, legal rights of the adoptive child is given to the Prospective Adoptive Parents.

In the year 2017-18, KSCCW scrutinized a total of 270 petitions. 242 were in-country adoptions and 28 were inter-country adoptions, filed under the Juvenile Justice (Care and Protection of Children) Act 2015. The Table below gives the list of cases scrutinized with a break-up of whether the placement was of a normal child, a child above 6 years (older child), siblings or a child with special needs.



There were 23 petitions of older children and 11 petitions for children with special needs. Among the children placed in Inter country adoption, 14 children were normal and below the age of 5 years, 3 children were older than 6 years and 10 children with special needs. One sibling group was normal children. The 10 special needs children were placed with families living in France, Italy, Malta, USA, and UAE, Spain, Singapore.

BALIKA SHIKSHANA SAMRUDDHI SCHEME

Balika Shikshana Samruddhi Scheme is an Educational Sponsorship Scheme extended to girls studying in high school at Government and Corporation schools in Karnataka. This scheme was extended to reach children from the 10 districts - Bagalkot, Belgaum, Chitradurga, Davangere Dakshina Kannada, Dharwad, Haveri, Kodagu, Tumkur and Shimoga through our District Councils and committees. 90 children have benefited from this scheme for the year 2017 - 18.



BALASEVIKA TRAINING INSTITUTE

Balasevika Training Programme is one of the major projects of the Council, founded in 1962. KSCCW has been running the project for the past 55 years. The training is of 10 months duration. Young women from remote rural/ urban areas who are below poverty line and who have passed 10th standard are eligible to undergo the training.

The course offers comprehensive training to serve as Balasevikas in

- Creche/ Balwadi
- Child & community development programmes
- Child care institutions for normal & differently abled children.

Balasevika training includes the following components :

Child Development & Preschool Education, Social Work, Health & Nutrition, Vocational Training in tailoring, embroidery, preparation of teaching aids, yoga, craft, spoken English & basic computer usage.



Proceedings of the project –

The 55th batch commenced on 1st July 2017 with an enrolment of 40 candidates for the 10 months' training course. Candidates from economically weaker section of society were given preference.

Highlights:

- Inauguration of the training programme was held on 5th July 2017. Smt. Sudha Raghunandan, President and Member-in-charge presided over the same.
- Founder's day was celebrated on 22nd August 2017. Mrs. Shallet, Programme Officer from INSA was the Chief Guest.
- As a part of the curriculum, trainees were placed for field work at the following organizations to have a practical exposure on the core subjects.

Special Schools – Dharithri Special School (3 units), Asha Special School, Aruna Chetana and Belaku Special School

Pre schools - RT Nagar, Sevanagar, Jayamahar, Jai Bharthinagar and Jeevanhalli

Social Work Centers – SMILE Foundation, Pragathi Seva Trust, YWCA, Sumangali Sevashram.

17 years old Malini hails from Shivakote from an economically weaker background. Her father deserted the family, her mother works as a daily wage labourer. Malini's dream was to secure a good job and financially support her mother. She applied and joined the Balasevika course.

Malini has scored good marks in all her class tests and exams. She aims in getting good marks in her final exams and securing a good job.

- The trainees were taken for institutional visits to have an exposure on its functioning. - Malleshwaram Shishu Vihar, Belaku Special School, VHD home Science College, Makkala Mandira, Primary Health Centre, Bakery unit - Hebbal & Grama Panchayath.
- The trainees visited the flower show at LalBagh Botanical Gardens on 11th August 2017.
- Nutrition week was celebrated from 4th Sept to 8th Sept, various activities were conducted in connection with the same. On 5th Guest Lecture was given by Dr. Rajalakshmi on importance of iron and a balanced diet. On 6th blood grouping for the trainees was done by Red Cross members. Guest Lecture on care for special children by Smt. Susheela. On 7th - lecture on harmful effects of junk food and awareness on diabetes.
- Guest lecture on balanced diet and recipes on cooking without fire was demonstrated on 25th Oct by Smt. Jamuna.
- On 25th Sept Guest Lecture by Prof. Kamakshi was held on life skills for the trainees.
- On 27th Sept the trainees were taken to attend a nutrition workshop at the Bakery Unit at UAS campus.
- Students from VHD institute of Home Science held an exhibition for Balasevika Trainees displaying their teaching aids.
- Two days workshop was conducted for the trainees on 15th and 16th of Nov. The topics were low cost teaching aids and cooking without fire. A story telling workshop was held by students from Kathalaya. In connection with world AIDS, day street play and awareness programme was held by the trainees at YWCA, Bangalore.
- Block Placement for 27 days was organized from 18th January – 14th February 2018 at People Trust, Sriramahalli. The camping places were Rajankunte, Honnenahalli, Shriramanahalli, Marasandra, Ittigalpura, Sadenahalli, Surdenpura, Vishwanathpura, Parvathipura, Adhiganahalli, Choknahalli, Margondanahalli and Bettenahalli, Bangalore.
- Women's day was celebrated on 8th March 2018 at KSCCW. Talk on women empowerment by guest lecturer Mrs. Geetha, Counselor was organized for the trainees.
- Annual Cultural Competitions for the trainees were held from 12th to 18th April 2018 to give them an opportunity to exhibit their talents.
- Campus interview for the trainees was held and all the candidates were selected and placed in different organizations.





BAL ROSHNI

Bal Roshni is an early identification, intervention and support programme for children with special needs. It endeavours to provide physical, medical and educational rehabilitation of children with disabilities. This support is available to children with special needs from disadvantaged sections of society and also to children supported by KSCCW through other projects like, crèches and schools. At present, 150 differently abled children receive medical and educational assistance. Corrective surgery and provision of special shoes, calipers, crutches and other assistive devices such as hearing aids, spectacles, and wheel chairs are a regular part of the programme. Assistance to continue formal education is a priority of this project.

Highlights for the year 2017-18:

- 100 children were given educational sponsorship.
- 18 children were given financial assistance for surgeries and medicines
- 13 children were provided aids and appliances
- 14 children were supported for physiotherapy
- 2 children were sponsored under 'Smt. Kavery Nadamangalam Vision Endowment Fund' which provides support for early identification and treatment of visually impaired children.

Bal Roshni's annual cultural programme for differently abled children, Bal Utsav was held on 8th December 2017 at Bal Bhavan (Cubbon Park) Bangalore. Around 240 children from 20 institutions participated in the programme. Cultural competitions like group dance, group song and fancy dress were arranged for these children. and provided lunch for all the participants and their care givers. All the Children were given participation certificates and gifts.

President Mrs. Sudha Raghunandan, inaugurated the programme. Member In charge Mrs Premila Ponnappa, Vice President Mrs. Indira Agnihotri, General Secretary Mrs Namagari Varadachari and other KSCCW Members and staff were present for the programme.

Bal Utsav 2017 was an eventful day for the children and they enjoyed thoroughly. The programme was a great success.

Physiotherapy unit



Many of our beneficiaries need physiotherapy before and after they undergo a surgery. They find it difficult to commute to the physiotherapy centers located in different places. The costs of the physiotherapy sessions are also high and they cannot afford it. KSCCW started a physiotherapy centre for differently abled children in 2014. Every year around 15 children are benefitted from the centre. We thank Mr. Dinesh Kumar Physiotherapist,

for his sincere and dedicated work for these children.

Our sincere thanks to all the individual donors, for their involvement in our small effort to bring cheer and joy into the lives of the children with special needs.



BALVIDYA PROJECT

Bal Vidya School Development Project commenced in 2008 and has successfully completed 10 years. The project is providing high protein breakfast to nearly 500 children from the government schools at Vaderhalli, Doddbyalakere, Shivkote, Somashettihalli and Mavallipura who hail from low income families. The nutrition supplements which are being provided to these children includes Beaten Rice & Jaggery, Moong Gram, Banana, Chikki and Nutrition Powder made with ragi, greengram, wheat, Soya, groundnut, fried gram, bajra and jowar.

The Para Teachers distribute nutrition supplement every day which is relished by the children. Height and weight of the children is checked and recorded periodically.

An over all improvement is seen in the attendance, health and academic progress of these children.

Highlight of this Project - 2017

- There is a remarkable change in the academic performance and attendance of the children.
- Ms. Sujatha Srinivasan conducted story telling workshop for the children at Vaderahalli school and distributed craft items to the primary school children.

CRECHE- EARLY CHILDHOOD CARE AND EDUCATION

After the closure of crèche units under the Rajiv Gandhi National Creche Scheme , from January 2017 council is running two crèches at Jayamahal and one crèche at R T Nagar. There are 25 children in each crèche centre.

Creche units help many working women to leave their children in a safe place. The crèche timings are between 9-30 a.m to 3-30 p.m. Every day nutritious mid day meal is provided for the children. Special attention is given to the children who are under weight. Various activities are conducted for the over all development of the children. Mothers meeting is conducted once a month. Issues on Health and nutrition are discussed. Medical check up for the children are conducted once in three months. Doctors from Veritas Diagnostic centre and Dr. Sheril Hegde conducted medical check up and the record is maintained. De worming tablets and vitamin A drops are given .

Members have raised funds to run these crèches . Generous contributions from ACE designers Ltd, Dr. (Mrs) Bharathi and Dr. Anil Kumar Mundkur, Pramod Ashraya (Regd), Mr. Rikutec Richter, Prof. Leela Rao, Mind Tree, Mrs. Kanaka Sirpal, Mrs. Prema Neelakantan and other philanthropists have helped us to run our crèche units.

CENTRE FOR EMOTIONAL SUPPORT (COUNSELLING CENTRE)

A Centre for Emotional Support or a Counselling center was started as a joint initiative by KSCCW with support from VIVEKA TRUST, Bangalore in Feb 2014 at the Council, which functions every Wednesday between 4:00 and 6:00 p.m. The counsellors are volunteers trained by Viveka who offer their services on an honorary basis.

The Counselling Centre has reached out effectively to the community apart from the beneficiaries of KSCCW, in the last year. The Centre has undoubtedly empowered the beneficiaries to cope with their personal difficulties or situations that otherwise immobilise and prevent them from consciously controlling their lives.

SPONSORSHIP PROGRAMMES

Education Sponsorship I & II

The Education Sponsorship programme which was started in the year 1999 with a small group of 4 children, has now risen to 110 children. Children studying in primary school are assisted under Sponsorship II and children who are in middle and high school are supported under the Sponsorship I programme.

Financial assistance is given to children in three installments. In the beginning of the academic year free stationery is distributed. Twice a year children write letters to their sponsors. Children's letters and marks cards are sent twice a year to the respective donors. A get together programme is arranged for the children every year. School bags were given as gifts.

This year 20 children had appeared for the 10th standard examination. Anusha T has secured 93%, 13 children have passed in first class and 5 children in second class. They have joined PUC taking various academic streams. 25 children were helped to buy books for college. 2 children have completed their degree.

LOKASUNDARI RAMAN WORKING WOMEN'S HOSTEL

As early as 1997, KSCCW realized the need for affordable and secure accommodation for working women in Bangalore. The Loksundari Raman Working Women's Hostel was set up for marginalised and socially disadvantaged women from rural and distant areas who migrate to Bangalore in search of employment.

The Working Women's Hostel, located behind the office premises, has nine rooms and two dormitories which provide accommodation to around 30 young working women. Admission to the hostel is subject to appropriate employment letter and salary certificate etc. Before joining every applicant is informed of the rules and regulations governing the hostel and is expected to adhere to them during her stay.

Subsidized accommodation in the hostel is also provided to Balasevika trainees and a few college students.

In addition, the Council provides boarding and lodging facilities on the ground floor of the hostel building for about 40-50 Anganwadi workers/ helpers who are regularly deputed for the training center at Bangalore.

The warden, assisted by ancillary staff supervises the day to day functioning of the hostel under the direction of the member-in-charge. All religious festivals are celebrated in the Hostel with fervor and gaiety and special meals are prepared on these occasions. On the whole, the hostel functions as a close knit unit. It is made to be a home away from home for the women staying here.





SHARANYA CHILDREN'S HOME

Sharanya Children's Home, R. T. Nagar, houses 25 girls between the age of 6 and 16 years who have single parent and come from less privileged families . They are provided with secure and spacious accommodation, schooling, nutritious food, good clothes, medical assistance and recreation. The Children's home was started in the year 1991, with funds from Government of Karnataka, Department of Women and Child Development and individual donors.

Tailoring Unit



The Tailoring Unit was set up in the year 2006 for adolescent girls and women in the neighbourhood from the economically weaker sections. The Unit aims at helping these women to earn an extra income for their families. They are taught basics of tailoring and to stitch garments. Two batches are conducted everyday. 18 students completed the course for the year 2017-18.

9 students attended the exams held during March 2018 and got certificates.

The duration of each course is 6 months. Every year around 20 women are benefited from the course. The unit also undertakes orders to stitch foot mats, quilts, cloth bags, cushion covers etc.



RICHTER READING ROOM AND KAMALINI ROY RECREATION CENTRE

This year 35 children were in this programme. Every day after their school hours children are very interested to come between 4 p.m to 6.30 p.m to recreate themselves. They read story and general knowledge books and some children take the assistance of our two supportive staff and volunteers to complete their school home work. Mr. Raghav Sundar and Mrs. Madhumita have gifted series of Harry Potter, Tinkle digest and Tinkle super star books as all the children showed more interest to read these books. Yoga classes were conducted twice a week. Moral stories, personality development classes were organized. Students from colleges help the children in bringing out their potential.

Picnic Organised for Children



In July 2017, KSCCW had organized a painting competition for our children. All the children participated in the event. They also had group activity, personality development class, exercise and yoga classes. Students from Kathalaya conducted a programme for the children by enacting short stories.

On 10th February 2018 we took children for an educational trip to Flower Land to a village near Nelamangala in Bangalore. Indeed, it was a memorable day for them. Children learnt how the flowers are used to make hair oil, perfume and some medicinal flowers and plants were showed to them. They enjoyed the trip and learnt socialisation. All religious and national festivals were celebrated.

During cultural competitions children got prizes. All the children received school bags as gift and for older children along with school bags, geometry boxes were gifted.



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
