ADOPTION SCRUTINY

KSCCW has been nominated by the Registrar General of the High Court of Karnataka as the sole scrutiny agency for scrutinizing adoption petitions filed in the state of Karnataka. Children in need of care and protection, who are eligible for adoption, are placed in adoption by Specialized Adoption Agencies through a centralized online portal called Child Adoption Resource Information and Guidance System (CARINGS). There are 34 Specialized Adoption Agencies in Karnataka that are recognized by the state to place children in adoption. KSCCW receives adoption petitions from District & Session Courts and Family Courts of Districts and the City Civil Court in Bangalore. KSCCW scrutinizes the documentation in the dossier that accompanies the case petition to ascertain that the dossier is complete and correct in all respects. The scrutiny also includes ensuring that the process followed is as per the adoption regulations notified by the Central Adoption and Resource Authority (CARA). A scrutiny team, comprising a scrutiny officer and a member of KSCCW, meet the prospective adoptive family to assess if the prospective adoptive parents have been able build a rapport with the child during the pre-adoption foster care stage and identify any areas of concern with regards to suitability of the parents for the specific child placed with them. The objective of scrutiny process is to assess if the placement is in the best interest of the child. A report of our observations is submitted to the concerned court. As a part of the process, KSCCW ensures that information regarding disclosure of the fact of adoption, legal rights of the adoptive child is given to the Prospective Adoptive Parents. In the year 2021-22, KSCCW scrutinized a total of 109 petitions 95 of those were in-country adoptions, 13 were inter-country adoptions filed under the Juvenile Justice (Care and Protection of Children) Act 2015 and one case was that of an inter-country adoption under the Hindu Adoption and Maintenance Act 1956. The Table below gives the list of cases scrutinized with a break-up of whether the placement was of a normal child, a child above 5 years (older child), siblings or a child with special needs. There were 10 petitions of older children and 9 petitions for children with special needs.

Among the children placed in in-country adoption, 85 children were normal and are below the age of 5 years, and 8 older children. Children placed in inter-country adoption were placed with families living in Italy, Australia, Spain, United Kingdom, USA and New Zealand. Nine of the 13 children placed inter-country adoption were children with special needs, two children who don't have any special needs were placed with their relatives.

AROGYA

HEALTH CARE SERVICES FOR WOMEN & CHILDREN

KSCCW's AROGYA – health care centre was started in 2018. Dr. Neeta Dhiren, General Physician from Veritas Diagnostics, Jayamahal visits the centre located at our office premises for 2 hours in the evenings from Monday to Friday. The medical consultation is only for women and children from economically weaker sections.

The residents of Working Women's Hostel, Balsevika trainees, children from Sharanya Children's Home and Crèches utilize this facility regularly

BALIKA SHIKSHANA SAMRUDDHI SCHEME

Balika Shikshana Samruddhi Scheme is an educational sponsorship scheme extended to girl children studying in high school i.e., 8th, 9th and 10th standards at Government and corporation schools in different district of Karnataka.

This scheme was extended to reach children from the districts of Karnataka. Due to the pandemic, the project was paused and will be continued from the following academic year.

BAL ROSHNI

Bal Roshni is an early identification, intervention and support programme for children with special needs. It provides physical, medical and educational rehabilitation for children with disabilities from disadvantaged sections of society. Currently around 124 special children receive medical and educational assistance under the project. Corrective surgeries, providing special shoes, calipers, crutches and other assistive devices such as hearing aids, spectacles, and wheel chairs are a regular part of the programme.

Financial assistance to continue formal education is a priority of this project.













Highlights for the year 2021-22:

- 7 children were given educational sponsorship.
- ♦ 25 children were given financial assistance for surgeries and medicines
- ♦ 20 children were provided aids and appliances
- 60 children were given financial assistance for club foot treatment
- ♦ 10 children were given financial assistance for the purchase of Glucometer strip kit
- ♦ 2 children were sponsored under 'Smt. Kavery Nadamangalam Vision Endowment Fund'.

PHYSIOTHERAPY UNIT

Many of our beneficiaries need physiotherapy before and after they undergo a surgery. They find it difficult to commute to the physiotherapy centers located in different places. The costs of the physiotherapy sessions are also high, and they cannot afford it. KSCCW started a physiotherapy centre for differently abled children in 2014. Many children have benefitted from this centre.

We thank Mr. Dinesh Kumar Physiotherapist, for his sincere and dedicated work for these children



BAL VIDYA SCHOOL

DEVELOPMENT PROJECT

BAL VIDYA SCHOOL DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMME was started in the year 2008 with the aim to improve the growth and health condition of rural children by providing them nutritional supplement. The schools reopened in November 2021 after the pandemic. 715 Children studying in Government Primary and Higher Primary schools from rural Bangalore are presently benefitting from this programme. The Para Teachers employed in each school distribute nutrition supplements every day which are relished by the children. Height and weight of the children is monitored and recorded periodically. An overall improvement is seen in the attendance, health and academic progress of these children. Our sincere thanks to TTK Prestige Pvt Ltd for their continuous support towards the project.





Summer camp report

Summer camp for the children was conducted in all the schools after their final exams were completed. Children participated with enthusiasm in all the activities conducted by the para teachers.

The day commenced with daily prayers, exercise, distribution of nutritional breakfast and the following activities

Art and Craft, Drawing, Colouring, Clay Art, Paper Craft, Dance, Drama, Songs, Folk games and Quiz. Awareness programme on Health and Hygiene, Cleanliness, Basic Etiquettes and Child Rights was conducted.



On the final day prizes were distributed to the students for the best performers. Snacks and goodies were distributed to all the children



BALASEVIKA TRAINING

BALASEVIKA TRAINING INSTITUTE, one of the premier projects of the Council was started in 1962 and has been running very successfully for the past 60 years. Young women from rural/urban area in Karnataka, who are below poverty line and who have either passed or attempted PUC/10th standard exams are eligible to undergo the same. The training is of 10 months duration. Our sincere thanks to The Bangalore RT Nagar Rotary Trust.

The training includes the following components:

Child Development & Preschool Education, Social Work, Health & Nutrition, Special education – early identification of childhood disabilities, Vocational Training in sewing and tailoring, embroidery, preparation of teaching aids, spoken English, life skill education & basic computer usage.

This enables the trainees to serve as Balasevikas in

- Crèche/ Balwadi
- Child & Community development programmes
- ♦ Childcare institutions for Normal & Special needs children.

Due to the Pandemic, this year the training was for 5 months duration. The course commenced on 8th November 2021 with an enrolment of 16 candidates.







Highlights:

- As a part of the curriculum, trainees were placed for practical classes at KSCCW crèche.
- Workshops and awareness programmes on various topics were conducted as a part of the training programme.
- ♦ Final exams were held from 14th March to 22nd March 2022.
- ♦ Valedictory function and distribution of certificates were held on 26th March 2022
- Campus interviews were conducted by different organizations and 12 candidates secured job placements.









CRÈCHE

EARLY CHILDHOOD CARE & EDUCATION

The Council has been successfully managing 3 crèche units, two crèches at Jayamahal and one crèche at R T Nagar. **Altair Engineering India Private Limited**, Bangalore continues to support this programme since December 2018.

Three Crèche units have 30 children each, between the age group of 2 years to 6 years. Three teachers, two assistant teachers and three helpers are employed to provide day care facilities for these children.

During the pandemic there were no physical classes for children at the crèches. To bridge this gap the teachers conducted lessons online and worksheets were sent to the children on Whatsapp groups and through parents. Teachers continued to communicate to the children over video calls and assessed the learning of the children and they responded satisfactorily. Parents too showed interest in this new method of teaching and were cooperative. Online sessions were conducted by the teachers to the parents about the precautions and safety measures to be taken during the pandemic situation.



The children were provided workbooks to build school readiness skills in the preprimary years.

Worksheets were sent home every week to guide and encourage positive parent-child interaction at home.

National and religious festivals were celebrated online.

Nutrition food kits and personal hygiene kits were distributed to the families of the children in the month of July, August, September, November 2021 and February 2022, so that the children are provided proper nourishment even while being at home.

After a long break children started coming to Crèche Centre from February 10th, 2022. The crèche centers reopened with all the safety measures following the guidelines of the government. The teachers are fully vaccinated. Consent letters from the children's parents were obtained. Necessary COVID protocols are being followed.



In November 2021 a three-day workshop was organised for crèche staff on activities for overall development, managing children behaviour, adjustment to school environment after pandemic, importance of play, storytelling methods, nutrition, health and safety of children.



The Crèche unit at **Canara Bank Head Office**, J C Road, Bangalore for their employees' children was paused due to the pandemic.

EDUCATION SPONSORSHIP PROGRAMMES



EDUCATION SPONSORSHIP I

The programme was started in the year 1992 with 4 children and has now increased to 76. The children assisted are from 6th to 10th standard.

Annual financial assistance was given for 76 children. Letters from the children and progress reports are sent to their respective donors. Once the students complete 10th standard, they are provided financial assistance to buy their study materials and books. PUC and degree students are given financial support to buy books. Most of the children who have availed our sponsorship are doing well academically.

EDUCATION SPONSORSHIP II

25 children studying from class 2 to class 5 are supported with financial assistance for their education.

EDUCATION SPONSORSHIP III

(DE-INSTITUTIONALISING PROGRAMME)

This programme was started 27 years ago and continues to focus on the education of children. At present, 53 children are sponsored under the programme. These children are being offered educational sponsorship support and live with their families. The beneficiaries are in primary, middle, high schools and college.

We express our sincere gratitude to Dr. Niranjan Raju and Mrs. Sureka Bidappa, USA, Mr. Deepak Benegal and Mrs. Sunila Benegal and many other individual donors for their continued support which has helped us reach out to children from under privileged backgrounds and enabled them to live with their families and enjoy their childhood.

EDUCATION SPONSORSHIP IV

TaeguTec India Private Limited Bangalore

Under "SHIKSHAK SCHOLARSHIP SCHEME", TaeguTec India Pvt. Ltd, have sponsored 8 students for Pre-University Course.

Menda Charitable Trust

Provides educational sponsorship assistance to 7 children. All the children attend Middle and high schools.

Ahalya Endowment Fund

4 girls are sponsored under this fund. 2 girls are pursuing their degree and 1 girl is attending her Pre-University college and 1 girl is doing her 5th semester in physiotherapy.

ICCW Sponsorship

12 children are given educational support under this sponsorship scheme.

Altair Sponsorship Programme

12 children have received educational sponsorship under Altair sponsorship programme.

Smt. Meera Nayak Endowment Fund

This fund was started in the year 2009. Many deserving and meritorious students pursuing their professional courses are supported under this fund from Mrs. Meera Nayak. There are 19 students getting financial assistance.

LOKASUNDARI RAMAN

WORKING WOMEN'S HOSTEL

As early as 1997, KSCCW realized the need for affordable and secure accommodation for working women in Bangalore. The Lokasundari Raman Working Women's Hostel was set up for marginalised and socially disadvantaged women from rural and distant areas who migrate to Bangalore in search of employment.

The Working Women's Hostel, located behind the office premises, has nine rooms and two dormitories which can accommodate 30 working women. Quality food at reasonable rate is provided. Admission to the hostel is subject to appropriate employment letter and salary certificate etc. Before joining every applicant is informed of the rules and regulations governing the hostel which they are expected to adhere to during their stay in the hostel. Subsidized accommodation in the hostel is also provided to Balasevika trainees and a few college students.

The warden, assisted by ancillary staff supervises the day-to-day functioning of the hostel under the direction of the member-in- charge. All religious festivals are celebrated in the Hostel with fervor and gaiety and special meals are prepared on these occasions. On the whole, the hostel functions as a close-knit unit. It is made to be a home away from home for the women staying here. At present 15 working women and BST students reside at the hostel.

Transit Hostel was started in May 2019. This programme was introduced by the Dept. of Women and Child Development. The purpose to start this programme is to provide safe and secure accommodation to women/students who come from other districts for CET, NEET and other Departmental exams and interviews.

They can stay for a maximum of three days. Boarding and lodging charges will be borne by the Department for Women and Child Development.

SHARANYA

CHILDREN'S HOME

Karnataka State Council for Child Welfare runs the Sharanya Children's Home located at R.T Nagar, Bangalore. It houses 13 girls between the age group of 12 and 18 years from economically weaker families. Most of the children are having single parents, from broken families, migrant labourers. They are provided with secure and spacious accommodation, schooling, nutritious food, good clothes, medical assistance and recreation.

The Children's home was started in the year 1991, with funds from Government of Karnataka – Department of Women and Child Development and individual doners. Sharanya Children's Home is registered under the Juvenile Justice (Care and Protection of children) Act, as Destitute Corrage for girls on 13th March 2012.

The children study at the BBMP High School, Ganganagar. Children are engaged with yoga, prayer, reading newspaper, library, life skills sessions, art and craft work, indoor and outdoor games, singing and dancing, and watching television. Religious and national festivals are celebrated.

Rotary Club of RT Nagar initiated a mental wellness programme for the children. The Rotaract members conducted activities for children. They also provided Covid Kit which includes Pulse Oximeter, Infrared thermometer, surgical mask, N95 mask, hand sanitizer and surgical gloves.





Due to the pandemic the children had to attend online classes till November 2021 after which the schools re-opened. 3 tuition teachers are appointed to support the children in their studies. They help them with their homework and other academic needs every day.

Regular medical checkup for the children were conducted by the Doctors from Baptist Hospital,
Bangalore. Dr. Pramila from Sai Diagnostics R. T Nagar is consulted for medical emergencies. Covid tests
were conducted, and all the children were vaccinated. Parents and care givers interactions are held
periodically to update on the progress of children.





The IYC center at R.T Nagar, Bangalore which houses Sharanya Children's Home, and crèche unit is more than 32 years and required repairs.

We thank **TaeguTec India Pvt Limited** for their generous contribution towards the repair works. The compound wall which was in a dilapidated condition was demolished and newly constructed with foundation and pillars. Restrooms on the first floor were renovated. Water proofing of the entire terrace was done for seepage. Fabricated aluminum cubicle was fixed as dressing room for the children.



SMT. MEENAKSHI SIVARAMAKRISHNAN READING ROOM

Since April 2019, Smt. Meenakshi Sivaramakrishnan, our past President, has continued to support the Reading Room for children. Around 40 children from nearby slums regularly come to the centre to read general knowledge and story books from 4 p.m to 6 p.m. Two teachers and two volunteers help the children with their homework and academics.

On Saturdays the children come early and are engaged in different group activities, games and dance. All National and religious festivals were celebrated. Summer camp and get together programmes were also conducted for these children



TAILORING UNIT

Tailoring unit was setup in the year 2006, for adolescent girls and women in the neighbourhood from the economically weaker section. The programme aims at helping these girls and women to earn a living. 20 students in 2 batches undergo training every day. The students are taught the basics of tailoring and to stitch garments. Certificates are issued on completion of the 6 months' course. The response has been favourable and very beneficial.



VOCATIONAL TRAINING SUPPORT



KSCCW's Vocational Training Support has been initiated to cater to the needs of young boys and girls who have completed their 10th standard with a minimum mark of 50% and above. The following are few of the courses opted by the beneficiaries -

- ♦ ITI
- ♦ Diploma in any stream like computer hardware, electrical repair and plumbing etc
- ♦ Carpentry
- TV, Mobile, Refrigerator, washing machine and other electrical appliance repair
- ♦ Automobile course 2-wheeler, 4-wheeler, etc.

The project aims at helping young children from the economically weaker sections to undergo short term vocational training. This helps them to secure good jobs within a short period of time thereby making them economically independent.

The duration of the courses depends on the course selected by the beneficiary, and he/she is provided financial support until the completion of the course. 7 students benefitted from the programme for the year 2021-2022


